We hope this guidebook answers all your questions. If not, please call us at 914-693-7111 and we'll be more then happy to help you. Please know that from mid-June to the end of August, phone is the quickest way we can answer your questions.

Required Forms:

ALL FORMS HAVE A DUE DATE OF 4/1/2025

On the Campanion App you will find all the required forms needed for camp. They will all need to be completed as soon as possible and we MUST have them before the start of camp to ensure we have everything we need to make your child's summer camp experience an amazing one.

Required forms are located on the Campanion App and include the following:

Medical Forms highlighted in blue color will need a doctors signature. NO CAMPER will be allowed to attend camp without the Medical Forms completed and signed!

<u>Physical Exam</u> & <u>Immunization</u>: Please upload a copy of your child's most recent physical and immunization record from their doctor.

<u>Doctors Standing Order and Medication Form:</u> These two forms will need to be printed and signed by **BOTH** you and the doctor. Once completed it can be scanned and uploaded via the App.

Meningitis: This will need to be printed and signed by the parent then scanned and uploaded via the App.

<u>Parent Authorization:</u> This will need to be printed, signed. Than scanned and uploaded along with your campers insurance card via the App.

<u>Bunk Request:</u> Filled out by Parent, right on the App. Please note we can only accept 2 requests and they need to be the same age, gender and grade. Read Bunk Request info in this guide before completing.

Additional Options: Filled out by Parent right on the App. This includes Linens, Horseback for Arts Campers, instrument rentals and travel.

<u>Health History:</u> Filled out by Parent right on the App. This will help us take great care of your camper. All dietary needs, past or current medical conditions, social emotional needs will be completed here.

<u>Camp Activities You Want:</u> Filled out by camper/parent right on the App. Please list all activities you are interested in trying at camp. Parents please add if you agree/disagree with the activities your camper has listed.



PHONE NUMBERS AND SHIPPING ADDRESSES

Please call us because email service during the summer is unreliable. Your camper's Unit Leader will call you with an update before the end of the first week of camp; this allows us time to get to know your camper. The Unit Leader will also arrange the weekly day and time for your camper to call you for a 5-minute touch-base (using our landline phones). Campers do not have access to Wi-Fi. If your camper ever communicates anything to you that you think we should be aware of, please don't assume we know it – our campers are so sweet and kind that sometimes they don't share everything with us. The more we know, the better we can help your camper have the best time at camp.

Mail to campers

Campers are welcome to receive mail (and send mail too!). Please feel free to send mail to your campers as often as you wish, but please limit it to letters.

CARE PACKAGES: packages to be shared with other campers are not necessary. Please don't send items to be shared with the whole bunk; we truly appreciate the thought, but it's safer for all campers just to send your child what they might wish.

Please do not send any food, gum or water — it will be thrown away. Please inform relatives and anyone else who might possibly send them something and tell your camper to inform their friends. Thank you for understanding that if food is sent by mistake, we will not hold it for the time your camper is with us....under any circumstances. If your camper has a birthday during their stay with us, we will do a few things to celebrate: they will call you for a chat — even if it's not their call night and we'll make them a birthday cake and the whole camp will sing Happy Birthday to them.

Shipping Luggage

Please send via UPS if you choose to have your camper take our BUS or FLY to Camp. UPS (United Parcel Service) is the service we suggest; they offer pick up from your house: 1-800-PICK-UPS. We do not accept trunks. Please use soft luggage only; duffel bags are ideal. Soft luggage with wheels also works. Do not use hard-sided suitcases. Again, **NO TRUNKS CAN BE USED** (even if you are dropping off your camper). Campers will unpack into cubbies/drawers/hanging space.

Electronics, Photos During Camp, and After Camp Communication

ELECTRONICS

We have a common-sense policy about electronics; they are permitted, but we don't let them interfere with camp. Most campers will have cell phones because they use them as their camera and sometimes as a creative tool.

There is, however, no Wi-Fi for campers and little cell service. The photos on our site demonstrate our culture and the environment that's most typical. Campers quickly realize that camp is much more exciting than their phone! They are surprised to learn that they can be so happy without using their phone. They do not get to use them whenever they want.

If they are trying to call/text/etc., we let them know that this is an issue and they generally stop. If they don't stop, we do confiscate their phone. We only have to do this for a few campers each session – this is not a pervasive problem.

PHOTOS TAKEN DURING CAMP

During camp, we will post photos via the Campanion app.

We focus on capturing great moments unobtrusively instead of ensuring every camper gets photographed (our campers would not appreciate that).

LONG LAKE CAMP FOR THE ARTS ONLY RECORDINGS OF PERFORMANCES, MUSIC AND FILMS AND RE-ENROLLING

Links to videos of all the shows (including SoundCloud recordings and camper-made Films) will be emailed to everyone in October.

After camp, we'll also post photos on our social media.

We will invite you to re-enroll during Visitors' Weekend. If you choose to do that, we'll send you official confirmation (including the Golden Ticket) in September. If you decide not to enroll at that time, we'll follow up with you; we love speaking with our families and finding out how we can help them return. The lowest rates for returners are usually available at Visitors' Weekend and the rate goes up a bit in September. Generally, the earlier you re-enroll, the better your rate will be.



Travel TO Camp: **BUS**; chartered bus pickup (only our campers and staff are on buses)

- Please follow **COMPLETE INSTRUCTIONS**
- If you choose to use the Bus option and then change your mind (or if the pick-up location you need changes), you MUST call us right away please (914-693-7111).
- There is an \$100 charge for Bus transportation
- All buses usually arrive at camp around 4:30/5:00 p.m.
- Lunch: Campers need to bring a disposable lunch.
- Luggage: please ship as much as possible to us (see below for details). Campers can bring only <u>one</u> duffel bag to the chartered buses along with musical instruments, tennis racket, sleeping bag. We do not accept trunks.
- Medication: please pack any medication in a separate bag you can hand directly to our staff. Do not pack any medications (OTC or prescription) in your campers bag
- Please do not send your camper with any cash.

(This will bring you to Otis Garage Surface lot by Dick's Sporting Goods. DO NOT PARK GARAGE.)

CLIFTON PARK

Please be there by **1:30 p.m.**, Bus departs approximately 2:00 p.m.

(Clifton Park Rest Area off the New York State Northway – Rt. 87 – between Exits 9 & 10)



Travel TO Camp: **FLY**; we pick campers up only at Albany Airport (airport code ALB)

- There is an \$100 charge if we also take your camper back to Albany for their flight home, there is no additional charge.
- Our most-trusted staff handle the airport pick-up; they'll be looking for your camper and they are easy to find because they wear brightly colored t-shirts that say "Long Lake Camp" in large letters.
- Unaccompanied Minor: the airlines usually require the contact details of the person responsible for pickup please call or email us and we'll share that with you.
- Please call us before paying for your tickets so we can be certain they are for the correct day/time.
- Please avoid connections through Newark, NJ airport (they have the most flight delays/cancellations).
- Luggage: please ship as much as possible to us before your camper arrives (see below for details). Campers
 can bring only <u>one</u> duffel bag to the airport pick-up. Musical instruments, tennis racket, sleeping bag, etc. can
 be carried separately. <u>NO TRUNKS CAN BE TAKEN.</u>
- Medication: please pack any medication (prescription and over-the-counter in original containers) in a
 separate bag your camper can hand directly to our staff for safe-keeping during the trip up to camp. We will
 turn the medications into the infirmary upon arrival at camp. Please also be positive that any medication you
 send matches the Medical Forms exactly. The only medication campers are permitted to keep with them are
 rescue inhalers and epi-pens.
- International campers: we highly recommend obtaining a valid U.S. Visa for anyone with a foreign passport; please be positive that their names on their passports match their Visas and their tickets exactly. Please instruct your camper to turn in their passport upon arrival at camp (we'll hold it in our safe) and to retrieve it before leaving.
- Please do not send your camper with any cash there is nothing for them to buy and we do not allow our staff to accept tips. If your camper is flying home and needs cash for that trip, we have a safe we can store it in for them they need to bring it to the office.

cream social. This way, they won't miss any of the fun!

Travel TO Camp: DRIVE; you're welcome to drop your camper off

- GPS address: 83 Long Lake Camp Way, Long Lake, NY 12847. Please be sure to use Exit 23 for Warrensburg.
 GPS directions suggest Exit 24 off the Northway, but your trip will be easier if you use Exit 23 which is for Route 9 you'll have more options for gas, food, etc.
- Medication: please pack any medication (prescription and over-the-counter in original containers) in a separate bag you can hand directly to our staff who will turn the medications into the infirmary. Please also be positive that any medication you send matches the Medical Forms *exactly*. The only medication campers are permitted to keep with them are rescue inhalers and epi-pens.
- When you arrive, please do not get out of your car, and don't let your camper get out of your car until asked to do so by our staff. We'll welcome you both and guide you through the check-in process.
- Thank you in advance for understanding that parents are not able to tour camp beyond the entrance at drop off. Please understand that it won't be possible to meet and greet your camper's Unit Leader during drop off; they will be in touch with you after the first few days of camp to give you an update.
- We'll take campers to their bunks once all their bunkmates have arrived and we'll help them settle in.
- If your camper wishes to bring snacks with them upon arrival, that's fine they'll be able to keep them with them.
- Please do not send your camper with any cash there is nothing for them to buy and we do not allow our staff to accept tips. If your camper is flying home and needs cash for that trip, we have a safe we can store it in for them they need to bring it to the office.

Long Lake was created so you are in control of your schedule with our help and guidance. Getting everything you want at Long Lake Camp is truly easy! Everyone is included.

No matter your age or level of experience, you have full access and choice in what you do with our help and support. You can try an activity and if you enjoy it, choose it again; if you don't enjoy it, you don't have to choose it again.

Steps to your perfect summer...

- 1. Watch our videos and look over other parts of the website (if you haven't already) so you know what is possible to choose at camp.
- 2. Make a list of everything you most wish to do.
- 3. Tell us at camp what you want and we'll make sure you get started as soon as possible.
- 4. Make friends, stay busy and tell your Unit Leader what you need and want and you'll have the perfect summer!

Here is what will happen when you get to camp...

The arrival day is saying hello, making new friends, eating great food and meeting the staff who will live with you and be with you for mornings, meals and lights-out.

The first full day of camp you be with your bunk mates all day. You are introduced to every place on camp, every staff member, and we empower you to get what you want from camp. TO ALL OUR PARENTS: HOW TO PREPARE YOUR CAMPER

Thank you for choosing Long Lake Camp. We appreciate the trust you place in us and promise to take the very best care of your camper.

We want every camper to have the best summer of their life, but we cannot achieve this without your help and your child's willingness to speak up.

The key to an amazing summer is communication! We are very responsive and helpful, but if you or your camper does not communicate with us, we will not be able to help.

We need both you and your child to fully commit to the summer: trying new activities, making friends and telling us if there is anything your child or you do not like, or are not getting. Summer camp is a great place to develop confidence and self-advocacy, especially for our younger campers. Please do not tell your camper you will come and pick them up from camp after a couple of days. It can sometimes take a camper who is homesick to take a few days to settle. Our entire staff will work extremely hard to help every camper love Long Lake.

If your camper ever communicates anything to you that you think we should be aware of, please don't assume we know it — our campers are so sweet and kind that sometimes they don't share everything with us. The more we know, the better we can help your camper have the best time at camp.

Long Lake offers campers a tremendous number of opportunities, which can be overwhelming for a few campers — especially if they are a little shy. Please encourage them to speak up and tell us if there is anything we can do to help. Our Unit Leaders excel at helping campers if they tell us what they need or if there are any problems. When talking to your child's Unit Leader, please tell them of any concerns regarding your child participating or if your child may appear happy and busy but may need to be motivated further to take full advantage of everything.

Bunk Assignments and Bunk Requests

If your camper is new to us, please be assured that there will be many other new campers right around their age who also don't know anyone in the bunk. We keep the age range in each bunk as narrow as possible – it's usually about a year to a year-and-a-half between the youngest and oldest camper. Your camper will never be the only new camper in their bunk – regardless which session they attend! Most campers arrive the first day of each session. There will be a few who are staying for multiple sessions, but we take this into account as well when doing bunk assignments.

All campers learn their bunk assignments on the first day of the session.

Campers are welcome to provide up to two names of other campers they would like to be their bunk mates. Please ask your camper to confirm with the friend(s) they would like to bunk with that they have also filled out a request to bunk with them. You can make this request on the Campanion App. We do our best to accommodate all requests but cannot guarantee everyone will get what they wish as age, grade, number of campers in each age group and session all have a bearing on the decision. We will do everything possible to grant at least one of their requests.

Thank you in advance for understanding that we do not accept requests for specific bunks.

Medication Information Both Prescription (RX) and Over-The-Counter (OTC)

Sending medication to camp:

Any medication you send to camp, both prescription and over-the-counter, must be in its original container with your camper's name on it and must be turned into us when you arrive. Campers are not permitted to keep any medication with them in the bunk (rescue inhalers and Epi Pens are the only exceptions).

The prescription medication you send to camp MUST match the list of prescription medications on the Medical Forms **EXACTLY** in terms of the type of medication as well as dosage instructions.

Please compare the medications you're sending with what you've submitted on the Medical Forms just before camp to make certain nothing has changed. This will help avoid any delay in us helping your child stay healthy if there has been a medication change. If there is a mismatch, we are unable to give your camper the medication.

All medications are stored in and dispensed from our infirmary:

The only medication campers are permitted to have in the bunk are rescue inhalers and/or Epi Pens. All medication is dispensed by our staff Registered Nurses.

What to do if the <u>PRESCRIPTION</u> medication your camper will bring to camp changes *after* you've completed the Medical Forms:

You must get a signed note from the same doctor who signed the form on their letterhead stating exactly what your child needs to take along with frequency, timing and dosage. It is **not** necessary to have the Medical Forms redone. This only applies to prescription medication.
